Though Human/Child sacrifice declined as a result of tough rules imposed by the police and the members of the community, it still remained a terrible social evil. Everyone found involved in child/human sacrifice were treated very harshly and this forced the wicked act to reduce.

The Lord's work has remained our source of encouragement seeing some give their lives to the Lord. We covet your prayers always.

Evangelism and Baptism.

As result of my deliberate plan to evangelise, I had a massive baptism of men and women in one go. Needless to say that in our poor community, people find refuge in the Lord. Like Jesus said, 'Come to Me all you who labor and are heavy laden and I will give you rest,' Matt 11:28 makes a lot of sense to these poor people.
