First of all, receive my greetings and wishes that in this New Year we may continue enjoying all the blessings that we had in the past and that we persevere, in spite of the opposition which the enemy puts on us every day.

We thank God that, beginning in Dec., we are meeting in the covered basketball court of the Maria Goretti elementary school. This school is located at the beginning of Branger Ave. on the edge of downtown, in the San Blas sector.

During the month of Dec. my wife began to visit some of the neighbors in San Blas, along with our youngest daughter Elizabeth, passing out tracts and inviting them to worship with us. This motivated the rest of the family to do the same, after the services. We have spoken with some other people, but nothing really serious yet. Anyway, our goal is to do this every Sunday after services.

As I said in my earlier report, we are practically starting over, which obliges us to stay encouraged so that we go forward with the work. We recognize that the work we have this year is not easy and much of it depends on our (the family) attitudes.

The fact that I got out (knocking doors) with Josue and Sabelis, with Sarai and Elizabeth, gives us all encouragement and makes the children feel as if they are doing something important and useful. In the other cities I've worked in, Sabelis and I went out to teach and the children stayed home. Now that they are older we are doing it for the first time with them. I believe this has been important and we want to take advantage of this situation so that they will truly feel personally involved in the personal work. Apart from the spiritual results that the church may have from this, I believe the most important thing is the courage our children can acquire in this new era of the church here. Generally speaking, they are obedient children, wholesome, diligent in their studies, and well disciplined, but they lack this necessary ingredient in their spiritual growth (preaching the Word), which should motivate them to study their Bible with a more serious view, to be able to give an answer for their hope in Christ. This fills me with hope and optimism for the year we are beginning.
